

# Exploring the Structure of Personality Symptoms in a Trauma-Exposed Community Sample

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## Introduction

- There are growing debates about the definition of PTSD and its relationship to personality pathology<sup>1,2</sup>
- PTSD shares similarities with anxiety, depression, substance use, ADHD, and various personality disorders<sup>3-6</sup>
- Current HiTOP work tends to focus on the syndromes/disorders level
- PTSD is placed in the Internalizing spectrum and Distress subfactor
- But there is still a gap about where trauma-related psychopathology fits within the HiTOP framework<sup>1,2</sup>

Study Aim: Explore the structure of personality symptoms in traumaexposed community members

## Methods

### **Participants**

- 462 trauma-exposed adults
- 19-73 years (M=38.7, SD=13.0)
- 313 Female, 193 Male
- 359 White, 42 Black, 20 Asian

### Materials


- Primary Care PTSD Screen for DSM-5 (PC-PTSD-5) $^7$
- Personality Inventory for DSM-5 Faceted Short Form (PID-5-FSF)<sup>8</sup>

## Analyses

- Calculate PID-5-FSF facet scores
- Parallel analysis to inform the number of factors to retain
- Exploratory factor analysis (EFA) with oblique, geomin rotation

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## Results

### **Factor Descriptions**

- Antagonism (ANT)
- Anxious Withdrawal (AWD)
- Depression (DEP)
- Dysregulation (DYS)
- Emotional Dependency (EMD)
- Psychoticism (PSY)

### **Factor Correlations**

- Dysregulation-Antagonism (.44)
- Dysregulation-Depression (.46)
- Depression-Anxious Withdrawal (.56)

## Discussion

- Factors had similarities to the HiTOP spectra but also some differences
- Observed symptoms extended beyond Internalizing and Distress
- Factors likely blend both traumarelated and pre-existing symptoms
- Findings may inform the structure of symptoms in response to trauma

### Limitations

- Online, non-clinical sample
- Self-report measures only
- Early-stage work (first steps)

### **Future Directions**

- Link factors to PTSD symptoms
- Link factors to other constructs
- Replicate in a clinical sample
